Year One

Term: Spring One

Mathematics

Place Value (numbers to 20)

Children will continue to develop their understanding of number for numbers up to 20. Recognising the value of each number and that for example, 15 is '10 and 5 more'. We will be using number tracks to support fluency in counting forwards and backwards.

Addition and subtraction (within 20)

Children will build on their learning as they explore addition by counting on from a given number within 20. We will use ten frames, counters, cubes and bar models. Children should begin to understand that in addition the answer is the same no matter the order, and that it is more efficient to start from the greater number than the smaller number

This term we will be:

Read a Story under a Tree.

English

Narrative (Contemporary fiction – stories reflecting children's own experience)
Children will write a series of sentences to retell events based on a personal experience
Non-Fiction (Instructions)

Following a practical experience, children will write up the instructions for a simple recipe

PHSE

Dreams and Goals: This unit will help children to identify their own dreams and goals, as well as help them to understand that there are steps to take and obstacles to overcome in order to reach a goal. We will also be celebrating our successes.

Geography

Children will learn about seasons and the common weather that comes with each season. They will explore different types of weather and learn how to record and measure the weather. Children will compare our climate with the polar climate, noticing similarities and differences.



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Science

Children will be using observation skills to identify signs of winter and autumn. Children will collect and record data about the weather in Winter. Children will also explore the affects of winter and how some animals might adapt to survive.

RE

The theme for this half term is 'Jesus as a Friend'. Was it always easy for Jesus to show friendship? The children will use stories, role play and games to learn about friendship.

Art

The children will be looking at the topic of 'Rain' this half term. Looking at pictures and paintings to inspire and influence their own artwork.

Computing

This half term will teach children how to use the Paint application to choose different colours and brushes, use functions such as undo and redo and to add text in order to create a picture or a poster.

PE

Children will explore travelling actions, movement skills and balancing. They will understand why it is important to count to music and use this in their dances. Children will copy and repeat actions linking them together to make short dance phrases. Children will work individually and with a partner to create ideas in relation to the theme. Children will be given the opportunity to perform and also to provide feedback, beginning to use dance terminology to do so.
