English

Year Three will dive deep into the world of traditional tales. They will explore alternate retellings of old classics such as, 'Jack and the Beanstalk', 'Cinderella' and 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. The children will then develop and write their own versions of a traditional tale.

In the second half of the term, we will be focusing on writing instructions.

PHSE

Puzzle Three will explore the children's dreams and goals. We will find strategies to support us to overcome any challenges we may face.

Over several lessons, the children will work together in small groups to design a garden/playground.

This term we will be learning how to write our names using hieroglyphics and dressing up as a mummy.

Mathematics

In Mathematics this term we will continue to develop multiplication and division between 2-digit and 1-digit numbers, practicing various calculations including exchanges and remainders. Later in the term we will focus our learning on length and perimeter. We will continue to consolidate previous learning of using our times tables number facts. Following this we will move on to learning fractions, mass, and capacity.

History

In History Year Three will be learning about Ancient Egypt. We will be taking a close look at ancient artifacts; daily life as an Egyptian; Hieroglyphics; pharaohs and many more interesting facts. Year Three will also be taking a step back in time for our Egyptian day (date TBC) where the children will take part in a variety of activities relating to Egyptian life.

Science

In Science we will be developing our learning about how animals survive and stay healthy and helps children to learn more about what makes a healthy, balanced diet. They will learn about the nutrients that different foods provide and how these nutrients help our bodies.

We will also explore the different types of skeletons that animals have and compare these. They learn some names of bones in the human body and carry out an investigation based upon bone length.

RE

This term we will continue our learning focus on Christianity. The children will read about and discuss the bible stories that focus on Jesus performing miracles.

PE

This term's topic is Dance. Individually, and in groups the children will develop their use of counting and rhythm. They will also be given the opportunity to perform to others and provide feedback using key terminology.

Art

We will be focusing on Egyptian art and learning how to write using hieroglyphics.

Computing

This unit is aimed at developing children's graphic and presentation skills by introducing drawing as opposed to painting. It also goes on to further children's understanding of layouts using a desktop publishing application. Children will learn to draw, order, group and manipulate objects to make a picture. They will also learn to evaluate and create effective layouts, combining text and images.
