English

Reading: The children are taking part in weekly guided reading sessions. Each week we read a new story as a class and create story maps.

Phonics: The children are onto phase 4 in phonics. They have learnt all phase 3 sounds.

Mathematics

This term the children are learning how to build numbers to 10. They will look at ordering and counting to 10. The children will become confident in recalling their number bonds to 10.

Practise ways of making 10 at home. Watch the number bonds song to consolidate this.

Understanding the world

This term we are looking at growing and changing. The children will be planting their own sunflower seeds, beans and plants for Daisy our Tortoise to eat. We will also learn the Easter story and why Christians celebrate Easter.





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Expressive arts and designs

Reception will be taking part in observational drawings this term. They will be drawing different things they see at Spring time. We will also be creating Easter cards and nests.
