At Bonneygrove, we place great value on the Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE) of our children. We are committed to developing the whole child not only through our Horizons curriculum and Golden Threads, but also our new PSHE scheme called Jigsaw.

Jigsaw has two main aims for all children:

- To build their capacity for learning
- To equip them for life

Jigsaw brings together PSHE Education, compulsory Relationships and Health Education, emotional literacy, mindfulness, social skills and spiritual development. It is designed as a whole school approach, with all year groups working on the same theme (Puzzle) at the same time at their own level. There are six Puzzles (half-term units of work) and each year group is taught one lesson per week.



All lessons are delivered in an age- and stage-appropriate way so that they meet children's needs. Next half-term, we will be working on our new piece 'Healthy Me'.
