English

Narrative: Voices in the Park and Where's My Teddy.

Children will be retelling these stories by sequencing sentences to form a short narrative.

Non-Fiction (Instructions):

Children will be following instructions for making a jam sandwich and writing their own instructions.

They will then use their imaginations to create a 'magic potion' recipe and write instructions for how to make this.

PHSE

Dreams and Goals: This unit will focus on setting simple goals and working out how to achieve them, working well with a partner, tackling new challenges and overcoming obstacles.

Our 50 things to do before leaving Bonneygrove...

This term we will be:

Read a story under a tree.

Mathematics

Place value (up to 20)

Children will explore numbers up to 20, learning how to represent them in different ways and how to write numbers as words.

The children will explore finding one more and one less within 20. Then they will learn to use a number line and begin to estimate numbers on a number line. Furthermore, children will begin to compare and order numbers to 20.

Addition and Subtraction (up to 20)

Children will use their knowledge of addition and subtraction to begin to add numbers within 20.
Children will begin to find and make number bonds to 20, using their knowledge of number bonds to 10.

Children will explore doubles and near doubles. Children will learn how to use subtraction to find the difference and also to solve missing number problems.

Science

This half term children will continue to learn about the four seasons of the year- focusing on Autumn and Winter. They will explore what happens to the trees – what happens to evergreen trees? What clothes do I wear in Winter? How does the day length differ to the Summer?



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Geography

Children will learn about seasons and the common weather that comes with each season. They will explore different types of weather and learn how to record and measure the weather. Children will compare our climate with the polar climate, noticing similarities and differences.

PE

Children will explore travelling actions, movement skills and balancing. They will understand why it is important to count to music and use this in their dances. Pupils will copy and repeat actions linking them together to make short dance phrases. Pupils will work individually and with a partner to create ideas in relation to the theme. Pupils will be given the opportunity to perform and also to provide feedback, beginning to use dance terminology to do so.

RE

This half term the children will continue to learn about Christianity. Children will be learning to identify when it is easy and difficult to show friendship and to explore when Jesus may have found it difficult.

Art

This half term, the children will be exploring the theme of rain using different mediums such as water colour paint, pastel and pencil.

Computing

The children will discuss and demonstrate how the Bee-Bot works, record a video ensuring everyone is in the shot, give a number of clear instructions in sequence, program a Bee-Bot to reach a destination and Identify and correct mistakes in their programming.

Spanish

Children will learn numbers up to 10 in Spanish.

Reading:

Please listen to your child read their practice reading book regularly. To improve fluency, support the children to sound out words and blend sounds together in their heads. Learn all tricky words from phase 2- phase 5. Ask questions to check understanding.

Maths:

Use your child's login to access Numbots. Work your way through the different levels and challenges to win coins and become top scorer!
