Mathematics



This term we will focus on the composition of 9 and 10. They will be learning how to write a number sentence using + and -

Collect objects at home and form number sentences.

Understanding the world

Children will make observations about plants discussing similarities and differences. The children will get to plant their own beans and observe how they change over time.

We will also be focusing on Easter - Children will know why Christians put three crosses in an Easter garden.



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Expressive arts and designs

This term the children will be exploring how to add music to familiar fairy tales. For example, we will be playing drums alongside Jack and the Beanstalks to symbolise the stomping Giant.

We will be experimenting with water colours to help us make mothers day cards, garden scenes and easter eggs.

The children will have the opportunity to make their own easter egg hunts for their friends to follow.

We will also be learning new nursery rhymes and exploring the rhyme and pattern that we can hear.
