Mathematics

In Mathematics Year Three will be focusing on understanding Place Value. The children will be using a variety of resources to support them in building upon their knowledge of recognising, representing and partitioning numbers. From Place Value the children will then take this knowledge and apply it to developing greater knowledge and understanding of using addition and subtraction. Finally, Year Three will focus on multiplication and division using sticky learning to revisit and consolidate all they have learnt throughout the Autumn and Spring term.

History

Anglo-Saxons: In Year Three we will discuss and investigate key aspects of the nature of invasion and settlement in history. We will learn how this important group of settlers fits into the chronology of Britain. Focusing on why they came to settle in Britain and the impact this had historically.





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Science

Plants: This is the first part of a two-part topic. The children will begin to learn about the parts and functions of plants and the start of the plant life cycle. We will examine the different ways that seeds are spread and work towards investigating ideal growing conditions for a range of plants.

RE

The children will be learning about Hinduism and understanding that in Hindu belief there is one God with many different aspects.

PE

In this unit, Year Three will develop basic running, jumping and throwing techniques. They are set challenges for distance and time that involve using different styles and combinations of running, jumping and throwing. As in all athletic activities, pupils think about how to achieve their greatest possible speed, distance or accuracy and learn how to persevere to achieve their personal best. Pupils are also given opportunities to measure, time and record scores.

computing

Year Three will be using iPad to explore more complex software when creating their own movie trailers. They will use photographs and recordings to tell a story, using relevant software to edit and enhance their videos adding music and text on screen with transitions.
