English		Maths	
Pupils will be learning about mystery and suspense narratives. After pupils will be writing non-chronological reports.		Children will revise previously taught methods and learn step-by-step new methods for formal multiplication and division.	
Reading		Science	
Children will read the Sci-Fi story 'Phoenix' by S.F Said. Following this, children will read Letters From the Lighthouse by Emma Carroll.		This unit focuses on Earth and Space, children will investigate our solar system and discover what makes each planet unique.	
Art		History
