Homework Expectations at Bonneygrove Primary School

At Bonneygrove Primary School, we believe homework plays an important role in supporting your child's learning and helping them to develop independent study habits. It also provides valuable opportunities for you to share in your child's progress and celebrate their achievements.

Homework Expectations – not all of these homework aspects will be given at the same time.

Children from **Year One through to Year Six** will receive homework each week that supports what they are learning in class. This will include:

- **Reading:** All children are expected to read each night using **Bug Club, Collins eBooks**, or a **physical reading book**. Parents/carers should sign the **reading record** to confirm that reading has taken place at least four times per week.
- **Reading Comprehension activities:** Reading a text and answering questions about what has been read.
- **Grammar:** word classes (adjective/verb/noun/adverb).
- **Mathematics:** Tasks will link to current class topics, covering skills such as **times tables, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division**.
- **Spelling:** Starting in **Year Two**, children will receive weekly spelling lists. In **Year One**, pupils will revisit and practise words from their phonics books and simple CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) words.
- **Topic Work:** Homework may also include tasks linked to **Science, History, or Geography**, which are often project-based and completed over a longer period to encourage research, creativity and independent learning.

Homework will be sent home every **Thursday** and should be returned the following **Thursday**.

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Differentiated Homework

We recognise that every child learns differently. To ensure that all pupils can access their homework successfully, tasks will be **differentiated** according to ability and individual need. Teachers will adapt tasks so that every child can participate, make progress, and feel confident in their learning at home.

Supporting Your Child at Home

We encourage parents and carers to:

- Establish a quiet space and regular time for homework.
- Read together daily and talk about what has been read.
- Practise times tables and number facts through games and conversations.
- Celebrate your child's effort and achievement, not just the final result.

Homework should be enjoyable and meaningful, reinforcing classroom learning while building your child's independence and confidence.

Thank you for your continued support in helping your child develop a lifelong love of learning.
