Communication and Language		Physical Development	
<p>The children’s ability to use more complex sentences will be encouraged by speaking into a microphone or recording themselves with sound buttons.</p> <p>We will continue Partner Talk this half-term.</p> <p>Children will be encouraged to listen to what their partner is saying and then feeding that back to the class. The aim is to refine their listening skills, improve working memory and build confidence in ‘public’ speaking.</p>		<p>We are developing on our gross motor skills by using the outdoor equipment, loose parts, wheeled toys and playing ball games. These activities support the development of upper body strength, core strength and balance which are needed to become good writers. Daily mark-making activities like Pen Disco are being used to encourage correct pencil grip, letter formation and hand strength.</p> <p>We are focusing on refining everybody’s scissor skills by cutting paper straws and strips of paper.</p>

<p>We are identifying our feelings using the Zones of Regulation and working on ways to bring ourselves back into the Green Zone.</p> <p>We are continuing with Rollercoaster Breathing and will learn other strategies linked to the Five Ways to Well-being.</p>		<p>We will read a range of texts relating to our topic ‘Food, Glorious Food!’ Children will be encouraged to anticipate what happens next and to discuss the characters and plot. We will continue introducing a new phoneme every week and practise oral blending of short words. The children will take part in daily Pen Disco sessions to support correct pencil grip, pencil control, sizing and formation.</p>
