








English		Maths	
<p>Letters: Children will continue to explore the orangutans of Borneo and Sumatra and write a persuasive letter about deforestation in the rainforest.</p>		<p>Post SATs Projects: Throughout this half-term, children will complete group projects. These will involve planning and budgeting events, as well as understanding and organising travel. They will be given opportunities to explore and understand different businesses and discuss profit and loss.</p>	
Reading		Science	
<p>This half term our focus will be on poetry. We will read and analyse different forms of poetry. Children will also have opportunities to practise and memorise play-scripts, in preparation for our Year 6 show.</p>		<p>Watt's the Buzz? Pupils will learn about electricity and how it is used in everyday life. They will explore how electrical circuits work and investigate the components needed to make a circuit function successfully. Children will be able to identify and name the main parts of a simple electrical circuit, including cells (batteries), wires, bulbs, buzzers, switches and motors. They will learn how electricity flows through a complete circuit and discover why some circuits work while others do not.</p>
