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## Beginning and End of the Day

- We have a 'soft start' - children should arrive between 8:35-8:45
- **Collection:** Anyone collecting children should be on our Collection List. If other arrangements are needed, please notify the office and class teacher, so we know who will be collecting them.
- If you are held up, please let the school know so we can reassure the children.
- Children should only wait outside their classrooms and not be on the playground (no ball games)
- Short messages on the door are fine, but if you wish to speak to staff at longer length, please call the office to leave a message and we will get back to you.



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# Absence

- At Bonneygrove we strive for 100% attendance where possible.
- If absence is unavoidable, a letter or phone call to the office must be provided to explain why the children are off.
- If no letter or phone call is received, an 'absence slip' will be sent home to be completed. The office may ring you on the day if there is no notification of absence.
- No holidays will be authorised through the year (DfE expectations). Any request for exceptional circumstances must be discussed with the Head teacher or Deputy head.
- Bonneygrove School sets dates for term time as recommended by the local authority – these are available on our website.



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## Communication

- If you have not done so already, we **strongly** advise that you sign up to Wisepay with the school office as this ensures good letter communication, saves trees and allows you to pay for some activities online as well.
- Important letters will be displayed in the classroom window and are available on the school website.
- Please remember to check your child's bag daily.
- All letters to school should be passed to the class teacher/TA or given to the office.



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## School Uniform

- The uniform must be school colours: grey trousers/shorts/skirts/pinafore or checked red and white gingham dress for summer. Burgundy V-neck jumper or cardigan, and a white long or short-sleeved shirt with a clip on tie. *Further information can be found on website.*
- All children should be in appropriate, plain black footwear.
- There should be no logos on the jumpers or shirts, other than the Bonneygrove logo.
- **All clothing should be clearly named.**
- Trousers should be smart – no jogging bottoms (except for Reception).
- We encourage children to take responsibility for looking after their own property.





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## P.E. Kit

Usual PE days for our class are:

- **Thursday** afternoons (Robin) and Friday morning (Woodpecker) – please have both indoor and outdoor PE kit: Plain white round neck T-shirt, burgundy or black shorts, black or dark grey jogging bottoms
- We advise that no earrings or jewellery should be worn in school. However, if small stud earrings are worn, they should be removed on PE days or taped over at home. (Please note we cannot share tape).



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## Medicines

- If your child has an ongoing medical need please make sure that the class teacher and Mrs Thomas have been informed.
- **Please check all dates for inhalers and other medicines.**
- If your child is on a course of medicine, please arrange how this will be administered. If this causes you difficulty, make an appointment with the Head or Deputy Head to so arrangements can be made.

- Please **do not** approach other parents or children on school premises. If there is a problem, please come and speak to us.

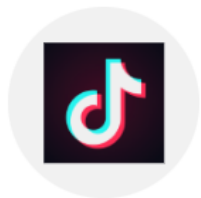


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## E-Safety

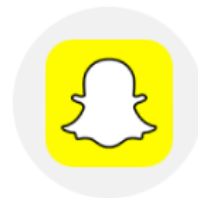

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## Jigsaw PSHE Scheme

In the 'Changing Me' unit (towards the end of the year), pupils are taught about changes to their bodies as they get older (overview on next slide).

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## Home Learning

- No longer using Google Classroom for home learning.
- Homework will be issued on a **Thursday** and will need to be handed in on a **Wednesday**.
- Homework will consist of: reading, grammar, spelling and mathematics.
- There is also an expectation that children will read at home daily (books and via Bug Club) and reading records to be signed and brought in daily (see next slide).
- Children should also access Times Tables Rock stars regularly.



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## How you can help further at home

### **Maths**

- Practise number bonds to 100.
- Practise times tables (TT Rock Stars)
- Ask your children every day problems involving money, time, measures, etc.

### **Reading**

- Listen to your child read regularly to improve fluency.
- Support with sounding out words and blending sounds together.
- Ask them questions using inference to check understanding
- Write a book review together!

### **Writing**

- Provide opportunities for your child to write at length, perhaps about days out or other experiences.
- Practise spelling all common exception words learnt to date.



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## Reading

- We ask that you read with your child daily and make comments about their progress in their Reading Record.
- Children will have two books allocated – one ‘free choice’ book and another book that provides suitable challenge for your child. Please ensure all books are brought in from home every day in book bags.
- Guided reading in school happens daily....

- Feel free to record any other reading in the Reading Records! (e.g. library visits etc.)

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## Reading

Here are the key reading skills we focus on in school:

<i><b>Predicting</b></i>	<i><b>Inferring</b></i>
<i><b>Using evidence</b> to say what I think will happen next.</i>	<i><b>Using clues</b> to help me make a sensible guess.</i>
<i><b>Asking Questions</b></i>	<i><b>Evaluating</b></i>
<i>Asking questions to <b>help my understanding</b>.</i>	<i>Giving my <b>opinion</b> using evidence.</i>
<i><b>Clarifying</b></i>	<i><b>Summarising</b></i>
<i>Using strategies to <b>understand</b> what I have read.</i>	<i>Telling <b>the main points</b> from a text in my own words.</i>
<i><b>Making Connections</b></i>	<i><b>Visualising</b></i>
<i><b>Making links</b> to other books or my own world.</i>	<i>Using clues <b>to create a picture</b> in my head.</i>
